

Following in His Footsteps

This is the first in our new series of stories of faith from our parish. Here, Charles Ng tells of finding God in small moments of disappointment.

•••

Grace in the Unexpected A journey of faith, healing, and hope

I have been reflecting on a small but meaningful moment that challenged my faith and stirred my heart. One Saturday after Mass, I left my hat and sunglasses in the pew at the church. When I returned the next morning, they were gone. Despite the kind efforts of the church staff, they were nowhere to be found. At first, I felt disappointed. The church has always been a place of trust, reverence, and sanctuary. Losing something in the house of God felt like losing a little piece of that trust. But as I pondered that feeling, something deeper began to unfold. I realized that even in sacred spaces, life can surprise us. People are imperfect and so are the moments we live through. But my faith is not built on perfection, it is built on grace. And grace often shows up in the unexpected.

This experience taught me:

- That my faith is resilient, even when tested.
- That disappointment can be an opening to a deeper understanding.
 - That God's presence is alive in how I respond.

I turn to Christ and choose to see this moment not as a loss, but as an invitation:

- To practice forgiveness, even when I do not know who to forgive.
 - To let go of attachment to things and hold on to God's graces.
 - To believe that someone may need things more than I do.
 - To trust that God is working in me, even through small trials.

I end this reflection with gratitude: for the usher who cared, for the quiet lessons learned and for the grace that continues to guide me. My faith may have been shaken, but it was not broken. In fact, it may be growing stronger.

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and decay destroy, thieves break in and steal. But store up in heaven where neither moth nor decay destroys nor thieves break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."

PONDER IN GOD'S PRESENCE:


Hamlet asks, "To be, or not to be, that is the question: Whether 'tis nobler in the mind to suffer the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune..."

God says, "Fear not, for I am with you, be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand."





Whereas Luke's infancy narrative features Mary, Matthew's account of the birth of Christ features Joseph. Matthew connects Joseph the betrothed husband of Mary to the Joseph in Genesis (youngest son of Jacob, Genesis chapters 38-50) especially through the occurrence of a dream in which the angel appears. St. Joseph is also "from the line of David." Even though Joseph does not speak, he is a righteous man, embodying all that is holy in the tradition of Israel. Joseph's openness to God's spirit prepared him to listen to a dream, receive a message from God, and act on it. Joseph is challenged to trust without knowing the outcome of events – that is the essence of faith.
